Manfeild Stadium is ideally situated for exhibitors from both Islands to attend. The venue is within the Feilding town boundary, only 15 minutes from Palmerston North, the airport and most accommodation. If you require any information regarding the above, contact the NZDE office at the Manfield complex on (06) 323 1886. Although the NZDE office is not a booking agent, Lisa at the office will be happy to point you in the right direction.

GENERAL RULES & NOTICES

To be run under the Rules of the Manawatu A & P Association Show Rules and Regulations

YOUTH SHOW:

1. *Youth Exhibitors* must be aged under 18 years as at 01/01/2025. All animals entered in the Youth Section are eligible to be shown in their respective Breed's and the All Breed's Sections and must be entered and led by the Youth Exhibitor in all the sections.
2. *Handlers Classes:* Only calves and yearlings are to be used, also the same animal cannot be used by more than one exhibitor/handler.
3. *Team Challenge:* This event is for non-professionals; in this context a professional is a person that travels from or to other countries to prepare cattle for sale or shows and is paid for his/her services.

DairyEvent ALL NZ SHOW:

1. The one entry fee per animal automatically enters that animal in all classes she is eligible for.
2. The NZ DairyEvent Organizing Committee reserves the right to amalgamate classes with insufficient entries or extend classes with very large entries, any decision made by the committee will be final.



LATE ENTRIES:

May be accepted but they will be at the discretion of the NZ DairyEvent Organizing Committee.

1. All accepted late entries will be subject to a late entry fee of the Class entry fee + 50%: i.e. \$30 + 50%, Totals \$45.
2. Replacement within a class is permitted but between classes is not permitted
3. For any issues relating to late entries, please contact the Chief Steward Jamie Cunninghame on (027) 583 3533.

SUBSTITUTES:

1. These will only be accepted for cattle in the same breed and same aged class. And again, please talk to the Chief Steward about any substitutes being considered.

CLIPPING FRAMES:

1. These are permitted, there is a charge of \$100 + GST for a frame site and the frame will be situated next to your cattle.
2. Clipping space must be booked and paid for on the entry form. If not booked and paid for at time of entry no frame will be permitted to be erected.
3. To be fair to all exhibitors, clipping frames must be erected in the space allocated by the NZDE Organizing Committee, not where the exhibitor thinks it should be.
4. A limit of 2 clipping frames per aisle.

STRAW /BEDDING:

1. Each isle will be allocated sawdust.
2. Sawdust is available for bedding; however, straw can be used at the exhibitor's own cost.
3. Sponsor *Farm Source* (Ph: 06 323 9146) will have shavings available at the exhibitor's own cost.

EARLY ARRIVING CATTLE

1. Exhibitors that are traveling extreme distances will be permitted to enter the Manfield complex earlier if need be. Please contact either Isaac Kelsen (027) 429 7704 or Chief Steward Jamie Cunninghame (027) 583 3533 to discuss your requirements. When contact is made, please provide the date & time of arrival for approval. All other exhibitors will be able to enter the Mansfield complex on Saturday 18st of January 2025.

RULES:

2. Unacceptable behavior, the use of drugs, drunkenness & under-age drinking will not be permitted. Alcohol is not to be visual to the public.
3. Manfield Park management requirements stipulate that **NO GLASS BOTTLES** are to be brought onto the premises. No glassware or glass bottles are allowed inside the stadium,
4. Any alteration of the conformation of cattle as per the Manawatu A & P Assn rules will be considered malpractice and could result in the exhibitor be disqualified from the DairyEvent.
5. With general tidiness on display for DairyEvent visitors and an (inter)national audience through our Live-streaming, it is expected that all exhibitors will keep their stalls clean and tidy throughout

the event. Exhibitors are also encouraged to dress up their stalls to further impress our visitors and overseas viewers.

6. All rubbish is to be placed in the rubbish bins provided and all cattle waste, saw-dust, shavings etc. is to be placed in the allocated sign-posted areas and bins provided. **It is the exhibitor's responsibility to keep their area clean and tidy - this includes when packing out from the event.**
7. Exhibitors are asked **NOT** to bring large bales of baleage etc. inside the stadium.
8. No dogs allowed in the stadium, day or night.
9. These are magnificent facilities; with the level of visitors and because we're on display through the live-streamed coverage of the DairyEvent, we need to keep our image of being first class, at all times! ***"Failure to respect these rules could jeopardize our event for the future."***

COMPLAINTS:

10. **Complaints regarding the event or the behavior of a person at the NZ DairyEvent are to be made to the Manawatu A&P Office Manager as soon as possible either in person or in writing. This must be done within 10 working days from the incident occurring. Written complaints to be emailed to dairyeventnz@gmail.com**

BY-LAWS:

1. All cattle in the breed sections must be entered in the name of the bonafide owner.
2. The date of birth of all breeding cattle must be stated at the time of entry.
3. The age of cattle shall be computed as of 1st June. NB: As the age of all cattle is determined from the 1st of June in each year, all animals shall be deemed to be one year older on this date.
4. All cattle entered in the Breed and Youth classes, if one-year-old or over, must have been entered in the recognized Herd Book of the breed concerned prior to the show. If under one year of age, they must be eligible for entry. Please contact your Breed Society for more information if needed.
5. Addition to by-laws as approved by the NZDE:
"Animals eligible for showing at the NZ DairyEvent must be registered with their individual Breed Society and comply with their individual breed society rules for association showing awards"

TB TESTING & NAIT REQUIREMENTS:

1. All cattle including calves & yearlings entered for the DairyEvent must be from a TB free and Accredited herd and tested within the Opsri Regulations of the animals' region.
2. Cattle from a TB free and accredited herd within a declared movement control area must be tested and passed within 60 days of movement. **A copy of the test certificate must accompany all Animals**
3. Checks will be made for TB declaration cards on stock arrival.
4. A NAIT approved RFID tag is mandatory for all movements of cattle, including calves. NAIT regulations for ear tagging is one registered NAIT tag per animal for animals 30 days or older.
5. It is the exhibitors' responsibility to record all animal movements with NAIT 48 hours prior to leaving the farm/property for the DairyEvent and then within 48 hours of returning to the farm/property from the DairyEvent.
6. The animals must be transferred to the **(Manawatu A & P NAIT number - 443920)** for this event.



7. ALL cattle must have Animal Health Board or Birth ID Tags
8. The DairyEvent Organizing Committee will inspect animal identification to establish TB and NAIT status.

STALLING OF ENTRIES:

1. In the event of cataloged entries not being exhibited at the Show, the Chief Steward shall have the right to re-allocate such stall spaces.
2. Feed receptacles will not be provided.
3. Exhibitors wishing to feed meal or dry feed should bring suitable containers with them.
4. Hoses will be located at the end of each row in the stadium. A water trough needs to be supplied by the exhibitor and is not to be shared between exhibitors to prevent the spread of transmissible disease (like M-Bovis).
5. Please ensure that the area around the water supply at each row is kept dry to prevent it turning into a 'bog' area. You will be reminded of your responsibilities and asked to see to any leaking hoses or troughs immediately.
6. The Chief Steward along with the NZ DairyEvent Organizing Committee reserves the right to ask any exhibitor to leave the event if they fail to comply with the rules of both the NZ DairyEvent and Manfield Park.

HEALTH AND SAFETY:

1. All exhibitors and visitors are expected to comply with the Health and Safety Act 2015.
2. All exhibitors and visitors are expected to comply with any National Health regulations at the time of the DairyEvent.
3. A shed meeting will be held at the start of the event to outline evacuation procedures and update exhibitors on any additional procedures or instructions.
In the event of an emergency, exhibitors are asked to follow the instructions of NZDE Organizing Committee members, Manawatu & West Coast A&P Members and/or Manfield Park staff.
4. Exhibitors will be asked for their Current First Aid certification (if they have one) on the Entry Form. This will assist the NZDE Organizing Committee with the Health & Safety aspects at the event.
5. Electrical equipment must be approved for use by a registered electrician and carry an 'Electrical Safety Test'-label valid for the period of the event. The NZDE Organizing Committee strongly advises that, to avoid disappointment, exhibitors get electrical equipment tested before arriving.

SHED MEETING:

1. A *Shed Meeting* will be held at the start of the DairyEvent:
8.30am Monday 20th January 2025
2. Attendance from all exhibitors and supporters is **compulsory** at this meeting to make sure everyone is up-to-date with the latest on the show.

NZDE 2025 - CODE OF PRACTICE:

The NZDE Organizing Committee have determined the following Codes of Practice under the rules of the Royal Agricultural Society (RAS)

The showing of registered pedigree cattle is an important part of the promotion, merchandising and breeding program of many breeders. Additionally, it is an important part of the program of the New Zealand DairyEvent to stimulate and sustain interest in breeding registered pedigree cattle. This relates to both spectators and exhibitors, as well as our sponsors. With this in mind, the DairyEvent Organizing Committee believes that it is in the best interests of the breeders of registered pedigree cattle to maintain a reputation of integrity and to present a wholesome and progressive image of their cattle in the show ring.

NZDE recognizes that there are certain practices in the proper care and management of dairy cattle that are necessary while moving dairy cattle to and between shows that is vital to keep them in a sound, healthy condition so that they might be presented in the show ring in a natural, normal appearance and condition. Conversely, it recognizes certain practices in the handling and presentation of cattle in the show ring that are unacceptable.

In keeping with the basic philosophy of the NZ DairyEvent, *ethics* are an individual responsibility of the owner/exhibitor of each animal shown. Violations of these responsibilities are subject to possible disciplinary action.

The following practices or procedures are considered unacceptable and defined as being fraudulent and/or unethical in the showing of registered pedigree cattle. When carried to excess these will be given slight to serious discrimination in the placing of animals within a class and would be seen as unsportsmanlike conduct on the part of the show person.

- Misrepresenting the age and/or milking status of the animal for the class in which it is entered/shown.
- Treating the animal, particularly the udder, internally or externally with an irritant or counterirritant.
- Surgery, or Insertion of foreign matter under the skin, performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body, though not to preclude practices required or involved in normal management.
- Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring, or other conduct detrimental to the animal, the breed or the NZ DairyEvent.
- Setting teats or manipulation of a teat to alter its normal position such as to unnaturally hold it plumb or to alter its length, is unacceptable and shall be regarded as malpractice.
- It will be the responsibility of the DairyEvent judges to take appropriate action if any teats are set, or in any way manipulated to an unnatural position.
- While all milking animals must be subject to examination, the judge(s) will be instructed to closely examine the top five animals, not only for set teats but for any other form of tampering requiring discrimination or disqualification.

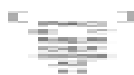
